Thank you for your interest in joining/rejoining C.L.A.S.S. for its 7th year!



Concentric Circles: Based on research conducted by the Good Project, as individuals develop ethical reasoning and ethical decision-making skills, rings of responsibility widen. In other words, as individuals become more concerned with others around them, they develop more responsibility and act on these responsibilities to make sound ethical decisions not only for themselves but for others they care about and for people and societies they may never know. In work, there are five major responsibilities: responsibility to the self; responsibility to others (including family, peers, colleagues); responsibility to the workplace (or, in this case, school); responsibility to the field or domain (e.g. education, public health, the arts); and responsibility to society. To whom are you responsible?
